"Aloha," means love, affection, compassion, mercy, sympathy, pity, kindness, sentiment, grace, charity, greeting, salutation, regards, sweetheart, lover, loved one, beloved, loving, kind, compassionate, to venerate, to remember with affection.

**A:** "Akahai," means **kindness**, to be expressed with tenderness.

**L:** "Lokahi," means **unity**, to be expressed with harmony, as Kaunoa Class of 1957.

**O:** "Olu'olu," means **agreeable**, to be expressed with pleasantness.

**H:** "Ha'aha'a," means **humility**, to be expressed modestly.

**A:** "Ahonui," means **patience**, to be expressed with perseverance.

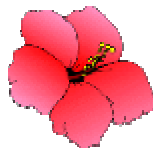
In 1970, Auntie Pilahi Paki, a Kapuna and Hawaiian Linguist, spoke of her vision, sharing the "Spirit of Aloha" at the 2000 Governor's Conference. The Aloha Spirit Law, encoded in the Hawaii Revised Statutes acknowledges the "Aloha Spirit" as a working and living philosophy of native Hawaiians, gifted to peoples of Hawaii.

*One of the most beloved songs written by The Reverend Lorenzo Lyons, 1807-1886, also known as Makua Laiana, was taken from an old hymn "I Left It All With Jesus" composed by James McGranahan (1840-1907).*

*A local classic, it is sung together as a closing song at Hawaiian gatherings with the holding of hands with those adjacent, swaying with the music, and holding hands up high at the end.*
